

WILLIAM ANDRADE

William Andrade, 70, of 56 Holly Road and husband of Mary (Nelson) Andrade, died Thursday morning at Morton Hospital shortly after his arrival following a short illness.

Born in Taunton, where he lived all of his life, he was the son of the late Joseph and Evangeline (Sai) Andrade.

He worked for many years as a molder for the former Glenwood Range Co., until its closing in 1948. He then was employed as a maintenance man for Draper Brothers of Canton until his

retirement in 1978.

He served with the U.S. Army's 351st Infantry Regiment during World War Two in Germany and spent 11½ months as a prisoner of war in Stalag 7A in Germany from May of 1944 to April 1945.

He was a communicant of Sacred Heart Church.

Survivors, besides his wife, include two sons, William J. Andrade of Bedford, Richard N. Andrade of Homewood, Ala.; four brothers, Joseph Andrade, Edward Andrade, Arthur Andrade and Alfred Andrade all of Taunton.

He also leaves two sisters, Mrs. Alfred (Irene) DeMoura of Taunton and Mrs. Hilda Medeiros of Taunton; two granddaughters, and several nieces and nephews.
