## Henry J. Feitelberg, prominent insurer

FALL RIVER — Henry J. Feitelberg, of 676 Madison St., the owner of a prominent insurance agency, died today after a brief illness. He was the husband of Ann B. (Kuss) Feitelberg and the widower of Mary (Kepple) Feitelberg.

He died at home.

He was a lifelong Fall River resident and a member of Temple Beth El and Holy Name Church. He was chairman of the board of the Feitelberg Corp. and president and treasurer of the Fall River Travel Bureau Inc.

Mr. Feitelberg was the son of the late Morris and Theresa (Brown) Feitelberg and a graduate of BMC Durfee High School. He received a bachelor's degree from the College of business and public administration at New York University.

His business career spanned 60 years, beginning in college. He led Feitelberg Corp. to a nationally recognized stature among independently owned insurance brokers. He also directed the Fall River Travel Bureau to regional leadership.

Mr. Feitelberg was a member of the Independent Insurance Agents of Massachusetts, the National Association of Life Underwriters and was a licensed real estate broker. He was one of the first members of the American Society of Travel Agents.

He also was a founding member

and certified travel counselor of the Institute of Certified Travel Agents. He was a long-standing director of the Durfee High School Distinguished Alumni Award Committee and the Honorary Order of Kentucky Colonels.

He was a regional leader of the Charitable Hundred Club of Massachusetts and a member of the Fall River area Chamber of Commerce, the Marco Polo Club and the Drug and Chemical clubs in New York.

He also was a member of the Madison Square Garden Club, the Presidents Club of Southeastern Massachusetts University, the Wamsutta Club of New Bedford and other civic and professional organizations.

Survivors include his widow; his children from his widow, a son, Karl J. of Kingston, and a daughter, Barbara A. Feitelberg of Fall River; his children from his first wife, two sons, Joseph H. of Fall River and John D. of Wakefield, Ohio, and Fall River; a daughter, Nancy F. Keating of Darien, Conn.; a brother, Frank S. of Fall River; 12 grandchildren; and several nieces and nephews.
