MRS. ROSE MARSHALL

NORTON— Mrs. Rose S. (Silvia) Marshall, whose efforts led to the founding of Attleboro's Holy Ghost Festival, died Wednesday at the Country Haven Nursing Home. She was 93.

Returning from a trip to Portugal in 1914, she and her husband, the late John C. Marshall, brought the original crown used in the Feast of the Holy Ghost, celebrated at Holy Ghost Church annually.

In May, 1921, the Marshalls helped to found Holy Ghost Church and had been communicants there for many years.

Until retiring in 1954, Mrs. Marshall had been employed as a weaver for Pawtucket Dye and Bleach Co. for several years.

Born and educated in Horta, Fayal, Azores, daughter of the late Antone and Louise (Thomas) Silvia, she had resided in Attleboro for the past 79 years. She formerly resided at 162 Grant St.

She is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Mary M. Wood of North Attleboro, and Mrs. Roy (Ruth L.) Sigman of Chartley; 15 grandchildren; 29 great-grandchildren; and several nieces and nephews.
