Adelino Murais, 68, of 93 Tremont St., the husband of Juliet (Nunes) Murais, died this morning at Morton Hospital after a long illness.

Born in Mizerela, Guarda, Portugal, son of the late Manuel and Alzira A. (Baptista) Murais, he came to Taunton in 1928. Before retiring at age 65, he worked for many years as a press operator for Larson Tool & Stamping Co. of Attleboro. He was a communicant of St. Anthony's Church.

During World War II, in which he served as an infantryman in the U.S. Army, he saw action in the South Pacific in the battle of New Guinea and the battle for the southern Philippines.
