

PACC treasurer Pinto dies of heart attack

Louis Pinto, 59, of 114 School St., treasurer of the Portuguese American Civic Club, died suddenly in Morton Hospital Tuesday night after a heart attack brought him to the hospital earlier in the day.

He was the husband of Irene (Ferreira) Pinto.

An Army veteran of World War Two with the rank of T-5 in the 73rd Ordnance Base Depot Company with the Army of Occupation in Japan, he was awarded the World War Two Victory Medal and the Army of Occupation Medal.

A former employee of the General Electric Company in Haskon, Inc. for 18 years, he was a general foreman, and the chief steward of the Taunton United Electrical Workers Union.

He was presently employed as a clerk at the Taunton Post Office for the past 12 years, and was a member of the National Association of Letter Carriers, Branch 71.

Born in Taunton, he was the son of Maria A. (Santos) Pinto and the late Joseph Pinto. He was a Taunton resident all of his life.

Educated in Taunton schools, he was also a 1972 graduate of Bristol Community College.

He was a member of the Portuguese American Civic Club for many years, and he was active in all affairs including the annual festa held by the club.
