ALBERT ROSE

BOSTON — Albert Rose, 67, of 157-H-Street, South Boston, a former resident of Taunton, died suddenly Tuesday night shortly after his arrival at Boston City Hospital. He was the husband of Alveda (Dias) Rose.

Born in Taunton, he was a son of the late William and Fannie (Denis) Rose. He lived in South Boston for the past 40 years and was a communicant of the Gates of Heaven Church in South Boston.

Rose was employed by the Boston and Maine railroad as a foreman of the maintenance department for 40 years until his retirement in 1980.

He was previously employed as a welder at the Boston Naval Shipyard during World War Two and, while living in Taunton, was employed for the city park department. Rose was also a former member of the Massachusetts National Guard in Taunton.
