

James St. Pierre

FALL RIVER — The body of a man identified as James St. Pierre, 24, of 19 Somerset St., was pulled from the Taunton River Friday morning by police and fire rescue workers.

The medical examiner in charge of the case, Dr. Paul de Villers, could not be reached for comment on the cause of death last night, but police said there was no apparent evidence of foul play.

According to police, the body was spotted by someone at the Dockside Restaurant, 600 Davol St., about 8:30 a.m. Friday. Police were called and the body was eventually recovered by a Fire Department rescue boat. Police said it appeared as if the body had been in the water for several days.

He was born in Fall River, a son of Mary (Neves) St. Pierre, and the late Alfred J. St. Pierre Sr.

Besides his mother he leaves two brothers, Alfred J. St. Pierre Jr. and Blaize M. St. Pierre; three sisters, Mrs. Louis Showers, Miss Robin M. St. Pierre and Cynthia L. St. Pierre, all of Fall River, and his maternal grandfather, Antonio Neves of Fall River.
