## Rev. Joao de Medeiros

Born in St. Michael, the Azores, he was a son of the late Joao J. and Maria Isabel do Carmo de Medeiros.

Father Medeiros sponsored the construction of a high school in the village of Povocacao. He provided some of the financing with the remainder donated by the Portu-guese government and the Gulbenkian Foundation of Lisbon. The institution provides secondary education in a village where there was only an elementary school before.

He studied for the priesthood at Angra Seminary on the Azorean island of Terceira. Ordained in 1926, he served 12 years in Azorean parishes before accepting an invitation from the Fall River Diocese in 1938. His first diocesan assignment was at Immaculate Conception Church, New Bedford. He became assistant pastor at St. Elizabeth's Church in November, 1938.

In 1942 he left to serve at Espirito Santo Church for 13 years, returning to St. Elizabeth's Church

as pastor in 1955.

Father Medeiros was a member of Bishop Cassidy Council, Knights of Columbus. In 1976 he observed the 50th anniversary of his ordination at a jublice Mass at St. Elizabeth's Church.

He leaves a sister, Mrs. Maria Isabel do Carmo Medeiros in the

Azores. The body will lie in state today and tomorrow from 4 to 9 p.m. at the Catholic Memorial Home Chap-

el, 2446 Highland Ave.
